THE LIFE OF A COIN

Big Buck is peeking into his piggy bank to see what designs are on his coins.

A circulating coin begins its life as an idea. Once the U.S. Mint designs and makes the coin, it gets passed around to people and businesses before it retires.

DESIGN - Coins are like tiny art pieces that fit in your pocket. Coins show people, objects, or symbols. They also include text called inscriptions.

COIN MAKING - The Mint makes most circulating coins from large sheets of metal rolled into coils. Imagine a big roll of wrapping paper! The metal of the coil matches the types of metal in the finished coin.

USE - The Mint sends the shiny new coins to Federal Reserve Banks. From there, they go to local banks and credit unions across the country to enter circulation. The Mint makes new coins each year, but they make up less than 20% of the total coins in circulation. More than 80% comes from people re-using coins to pay for goods and services.

RETIRE - Coins can last around 30 years in circulation before they're too worn to use. When coins reach the end of their life, the Federal Reserve removes them from circulation. Old coins are melted down and used for other things.

The United States Mint in Denver offers a free, guided tour of its facility. Tours are available up to 6 times a day, with tickets distributed on a first-come, first-served basis starting at 7:00 AM. The tour is approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes long. All visitors must be 7 years or older.



Halloween Pet Safety Tips

We all want our pets to enjoy a spooktacular evening as well. Follow these tips to keep them safe!

- Don't feed pets Halloween treats. They can get very sick. Stick to pet treats for your spooky pooch.
- Make sure your pets have identification (microchip, collar, and ID tag) and a contact number in case they escape through an open door while you're distracted with trickor-treaters.
- Keep lit candles, jack-o-lanterns, and other Halloween decorations out of reach of pets.
- Keep all human costume pieces away from pets, along with glow sticks, decorations, batteries, etc. When chewed, these items can be very toxic and harmful. Costume parts and decorations might cause choking, internal injury, or illness.
- Let your pet get used to their costume before the big night. Make sure pet costumes follow these guidelines:
- · Fits properly and is comfortable
- Doesn't have any pieces that easily can be chewed off or cause choking
- Doesn't block your pet's sight, hearing, breathing, mouth, or movement
- If your pet is wary of strangers or has a tendency to bite, put them in a room away from the front door during trick-or-treating hours, or provide them with a safe hiding place.
- Keep your pet indoors to stay away from the frights!
